PEPFAR's HIV and AIDS Community Grants Program offers direct funding opportunities to community-based organizations in districts with South Africa's highest HIV/AIDS burden¹. The Community Grants Program funds organizations that offer evidence based activities in HIV prevention, care and support; capacity building; reduction of stigma and discrimination; and democracy, governance and human rights as related to the national HIV response. Registered organizations providing any combination of these interventions to key and/or priority populations (populations defined below), people living with HIV (PLHIV), orphans, vulnerable children and youth (OVCY) and/or adolescent girls and young women (AGYW) are eligible to apply.
